

As you will be aware the Leiston-cum -Sizewell Town Council, Transport Strategy Public Consultation was run through the month of August. I would like to thank residents for attending the two Exhibitions, Clinics and for the feedback forms that were completed and submitted.

The Town Council has set up a working group to discuss and put forward ideas on how the Skate Park can be improved and extended. I was pleased to sit in on the inaugural meeting where users of the Skate Park were invited to be part of the team and to put forward ideas for a design for the enhancements. The Skate Park is a very popular venue for young people and I am pleased that they will be having some input into the future of the Skate Park. I look forward to seeing this come to fruition in the near future.

On the 2nd of August, Leiston - cum proposals attracted more feedback than Sizewell Town Council launched a consultation on some ambitious for management and community spaces in Leiston town centre. The wide-ranging set of proposals included a new one-way system, new bus routes, plans to enhance cycling infrastructure and several other initiatives to enhance the safety of pedestrians or road users, in addition to efforts to "green" the streetscape and create better spaces for use by the community.

previous "town appraisal" which led to a series of options for reducing traffic in the town centre. Thanks to the support of Suffolk County Council Highways, new proposals have been developed to be put forward for our towns' consideration. With the possibility of the Sizewell C development commencing in the near future, the time is right to ask for the community's views on how we should manage traffic into and around the town

The feedback process for this consultation was open for 4 weeks, within which time three one-to-one clinics and two exhibitions were held on the proposals to help the community make an informed view and send us comments. We have had some feedback on the proposals. with residents and businesses from giving us their views. Some parts of the

others, highlighting the ambitious nature of some of the schemes proposed. This feedback will help us to determine the future of Leiston's town centre. What was clear from the responses was the appreciation of nature, the environment and the safety of our community are as important to the wider community as they are to the Town Council.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to respond with their views. We are currently analysing and summarising all the feedback into a report which we will This consultation follows on from the share once available. Very soon we will be able to communicate what the next steps for the Transport Strategy are following this round of consultation.

## Net Zero Leiston Community Update - September/October



We are approaching the much-anticipated release of the Net Zero Leiston Routemap. This will provide a plan for how Leiston parish can achieve "Net Zero" carbon emissions and provide a blueprint for similar towns up and down the country.

The Net Zero Leiston Routemap will showcase all of the hard work, detailed calculations and community feedback achieved over the past 18 months. This replicable plan shows the current level of carbon emissions being emitted in the town, how these have been measured and what solutions can reduce those emissions.

The Routemap addresses carbon emissions from buildings, transport and agriculture. Solutions to reduce these carbon emissions include:



- Low carbon heating and energy efficiency for Leiston's buildings
- Exploring electric vehicles for Leiston residents and local businesses
- Improvement of Leiston's green spaces and biodiversity

t has been an extremely hectic but successful summer at Alde Valley Academy. Our wholehearted congratualtions go to our Year 11 students who have performed remarkably well in their GCSE assessments despite the extreme disruption caused by the pandemic. Our students have worked tirelessly alongside our dedicated staff to produce the high quality assessment material which provided the evidence required for the Teacher Assessed Grades. The progress and academic outcomes of our students continues to rise year on year.


